Malik's Prayer


Dear Heavenly Father,



50 Film Guides To Use At Home

As the coronavirus/COVID-19 situation continues across the UK, Into Film recognise that many schools will be closed, and many parents will be looking for ways to keep their children meaningfully occupied outside of school time.

Many of their film guides - which are designed as informal discussion prompts for after viewing a film - also feature extension activities that children and young people can take part in on their own, without the need for constant supervision. Below, they have collected 50 film guides with extension activities to help keep young people of all ages engaged. If you're new to Into Film, you'll need to sign up for a free account and log in to download the resources.

Many of the films are titles they believe people are likely to own on DVD, but where possible, they will also point out some that are currently available to view on streaming services.

Note: The information about films on streaming services is aimed at people at home only, and not for any film clubs still running in schools. Licencing conditions do not permit the access of streaming platforms from a school setting.

Year 7 have been studying the impacts of plastic pollution in our oceans as well as how we can limit our plastic consumption by reducing/reusing/recycling/rethinking!




2 antennas
