### **Summer 2020 – Arrangements for September**

As another academic year draws to a close, I think it is safe to say we have never experienced another one quite like it! The whole community has faced a range of difficult challenges and I am proud of the efforts and positive attitude of all sections of our school community during this period. It has been wonderful to see how we have been able to come together and keep the school open to everyone in different ways despite the lockdown. This is a credit to the spirit and optimism of everyone – RUAH in action!

I am very much looking forward to September when the government has said that we will be able to reopen, with strict safety rules in place, to all our students. With that in mind I would like to share our plans, which, given the changing nature of the pandemic and of government advice, can only be fully confirmed at the end of August.

### **Arrangements for September**

The start of next term will see a phased return to school for all our students. It will be done in this way to ensure that we support them to reintegrate successfully and safely back into school life after the lockdown period. For children in years 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12, this means that they will start attending school in the week beginning **Monday 7 September 2020**. Exact dates and times for each year group will be confirmed when I write to you with full details of our Covid-19 safety plans towards the end of August. I hope you will understand that sending out details now, when plans could change subject to the wider situation in the country, would not be helpful.

Please note during that first week back students will be working from home on some days while we reintroduce students from other year groups back into school routines. Live lessons will be provided on our Microsoft Teams platform for this period so that students will not miss out on their education. I was delighted with the levels of engagement that our online learning generated this term and I am sure that this will continue in the new academic year.

### **Standards of uniform and personal presentation**

As you will be aware, we set high expectations around uniform and personal presentation and this will be no different in September. Details of our uniform policy can be found on the [school website](#). I would like to remind parents and pupils that jewellery and extreme hairstyles are not permitted. If your child is planning to have a new piercing or a different summer haircut, please ensure that these are done early in the holidays so that there are no issues on their return to school.
