Main responsibilities and duties

- Ensure that all identified pupils make excellent holistic progress
- Promote high expectations and secure standards in terms of pupil behaviour and safety
- Provide targeted support to individuals and groups, as directed by the ASD Base Lead
- Contribute to the planning for teaching and learning by working closely with subject teachers and the ASD Base Lead
- Regular monitoring and mentoring/ liaison with staff across school to ensure consistency of interventions
- Be responsible for monitoring setting and reviewing individual targets
- Collate data and track/ coordinate additional support
- Support the ASD Base Lead as the leading professional with administrative tasks in preparation for TAC meetings, Annual Reviews and EHCP amendments
- Conduct Annual Reviews as directed with the ASD Base Lead

In relation to pupils

- Monitor the implementation of plans and report on progress achieved
- Provide extra support to pupils through knowledge of a range of activities and opportunities available to them
- Support the development of partnerships with external agencies and organisations to set up resources and initiatives to help address barriers to learning
- Maintain accurate pupil records and prepare written reports and evaluations
- Support the transition of pupils between phases
- Supervise pupils excluded from class or those following alternative timetables

In relation to the ASD Base Provision

- Support the ASD Base Lead by monitoring pupil progress, ensuring that appropriate provision is being delivered and updating the provision map/ support plans reflecting changes to the pupils' provision
- Observation of classroom support work and small group work
- Provide a significant presence around the ASD Bases at all times throughout the day
- Develop and promote excellent relationships with parents and carers
- Liaise with teaching staff to assess and provide specific support to targeted pupils to raise achievement and enable them to overcome barriers to learning
- Refer to external organisations who will work with parents and carers to help address issues around performance, attendance and behaviour

- Collate pupils' data for appropriate TAC and EHCP meetings
- Monitor daily pupil progress and attainment
- Ensure that all staff are kept informed of individual pupils needs and how best to respond to them
- Ensure that good practice is followed in all matters relating to parental involvement
- Work closely with Heads of House and other pastoral staff to ensure that pupils' behaviour issues are dealt with appropriately
- Build links with a wide range of professional and other agencies co-ordinating the support they provide for pupils experiencing difficulties
