
Brief details of Cultural Evening in July were shared and this will be discussed in more detail at the next meeting.



FREE SCHOOL MEALS

If you child is eligible for free school meals, the school receives additional funding called Pupil Premium. This funding is used by the school to buy additional equipment, resources, trips and support. If you do not apply and are entitled, we cannot receive extra funding for such things. Please support the school by checking if you are eligible for the funding and applying for it if you are.

How do I

register?

At St John Bosco College, we get an extra £985 for every eligible pupil who is registered for free school meals. This extra money could make a real difference to the quality of education we

offer.

Is my child eligible for free school meals?

Your child might be eligible if you

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-onUniversal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)

We've previously used pupil premium funding for:

- Educational provision/resources
- Academic interventions
- Wellbeing and self-esteem building interventions

You only need to register once at the school.

To register, please: First check your eligibility using the local government eligibility checker Free School Meal Eligibility Checker (Igfl.org.uk) and then complete a Free School Meals Application Form

Wandsworth Council (sjbc.wandsworth.sch.uk) and hand in to reception.

Alternatively, you can pick up a copy of the form from school reception.
