
WANDSWORTH LONDON YOUTH GAMES BADMINTON TRIALS – CONGRATULATIONS!


The group will be reading the first 100 pages this week before meeting again next week to share thoughts and reflections. We've already heard whispers that some keen readers couldn't resist reading ahead!

Flag Football Club now runs every Monday after school and is open to all girls across all year groups—no experience needed, just enthusiasm and a willingness to get involved!




YR 8 TRIP TO ST ALBANS

As part of their study of how Christianity came to England, Year 8 students have been looking at the life of St Alban and how he saved the life of a Catholic priest in the third century. As a result, St Alban became the first English martyr to give up his life for Christ.



The Education Dept of St Alban's Cathedral ran a very informative workshop for our Year 8 students who explored the life of St Alban in more detail. This was coupled with a visit to the shrine of St Alban where students were offered the opportunity to pray.





Some of our Year 8 and 9 students took part in a powerful session exploring CAFOD's "Cancel the Debt" campaign, which aims to end the burden of international debt for some of the world's poorest countries.



As part of their RE lessons, students will be writing letters to our local MP, Marsha De Cordova, urging her to raise this important issue in Parliament. It's a great example of our young people putting their faith into action and using their voices to stand up for global justice.

WHOLE SCHOOL EXAMS BEGIN 30TH JUNE!

A reminder that end-of-year exams (PPEs) for Years 7-10 and 12 begin on **Monday 30th June**. Students should now be revising 1.5 - 2 hours per day, including weekends.

This should be a mix of subjects, with regular breaks – for example:

- 30 - 40 mins revision
 - 10 min break
 - Another 30 - 40 mins
- (aim for 3 subjects per day).
