WELL DONE TO YEARS 7–10 – PPEs AND ATTENDANCE

We would like to congratulate all students in Years 7–10 who took part in their PPEs. It was excellent to see pupils approaching their assessments with focus, resilience and a strong work ethic. Staff were impressed with the calm and purposeful way students engaged with their exams.

We are also delighted to share that whole-school attendance reached 95% on some days, which is a fantastic achievement and reflects the commitment of our students and families. High attendance is vital, particularly for year groups sitting exams, as every lesson directly supports learning, confidence and outcomes.

100% attendance (or as close as possible to that) is crucial. Missing lessons can have a significant impact on progress, revision and exam readiness, and consistent attendance is one of the strongest predictors of academic success.

Thank you to parents and carers for your continued support in ensuring students are present, punctual and ready to learn. Your partnership makes a real difference.


The next round of PPEs will be for Years 11–13 and will take place straight after the February half-term. Further details will be shared in due course.



THE IMPORTANCE OF ATTENDANCE IN SECONDARY SCHOOL

Regular attendance in secondary school is one of the strongest factors in a child's academic success, wellbeing and confidence. Every lesson builds on the last, and missing school can quickly create gaps in learning that are hard to close, particularly in exam years.

Good attendance helps students develop routines, resilience and positive habits that prepare them for further education, employment and adult life.



Parents can support strong attendance by establishing consistent morning and evening routines, ensuring good sleep habits, checking timetables and equipment the night before, and encouraging attendance even on days when motivation is low.

Unless a child is genuinely unwell, attending school every day and arriving on time sends a powerful message about the value of education and helps students achieve their full potential.





MATHS MASTERCLASS AT IMPERIAL COLLEGE LONDON

Before Christmas, a group of eight year 11 students attended a maths masterclass at Imperial College London. The students spent the day looking at how to be an efficient mathematician and learning how to be efficient when given a GCSE question. During the masterclass, we focused on velocity-time graphs, circles, arcs, and finally vectors.



We were very lucky to have a tour of the campus, by some STEM students, followed by a talk from an aspiring astronaut, Dr Jackie Bell.

Overall, we had an incredible time and enjoyed all the talks and will hopefully apply these to our next PPEs.



- Follow the company on LinkedIn to show a genuine interest in what they do as companies often check if applicants are following the on the platform

LONDON MAYOR AND MOPAC YOUTH SURVEY

The Mayor of London invites young people aged 11–16 (Years 7–11) to take part in the Youth Survey for London, delivered in partnership with MOPAC.
