

A PRAYERFUL START TO ADVENT - WHOLE SCHOOL MASS

Both services created a calm and prayerful atmosphere, setting the tone for this important season.









Fr Andrew offered a thought-provoking sermon centred on the idea of "brain rot" – the online content that can distract or dull our thinking. He encouraged students to use Advent as a time to pause, reflect and consider the areas in their lives that may need renewal or attention, reminding us that this season is an opportunity for spiritual growth and positive change.

It was a meaningful way for students and staff to enter Advent together, focusing on hope, reflection and preparation.

Thank you to Ms Henry for recognising their efforts and nominating them. Well done to all three students for showcasing such fantastic culinary skills!




SJBC CHOIR PERFORMS AT LOCAL 'CAROLS IN THE SQUARE' EVENTERENCE

The highlight of the session was seeing them unwittingly learn to count to 10 in Japanese in the form of a story and actions, using the chaining technique.


They demonstrated skills including teamwork, communication, leadership, and creativity.

CELEBRATING INCLUSION THROUGH SPORT - POWER2INSPIRE

Our school recently took part in an inspiring sports event organized by Power2Inspire, an organisation committed to promoting inclusion and ensuring that everyone, regardless of ability, has the opportunity to enjoy sport.

The festival brought together pupils from several schools, creating an atmosphere filled with teamwork, enthusiasm, and mutual respect.



Our pupils engaged wholeheartedly in every challenge. Many commented that trying unfamiliar sports broadened their understanding of inclusion and helped them appreciate the importance of adapting games so everyone can be involved. The mixed-school teams also allowed students to socialise beyond their usual groups, making the event not only physically engaging but also socially enriching.



The event featured a series of inclusive sports activities specially designed to encourage collaboration between students of different abilities. Activities such as adapted rugby, boccia, new age kurling, sitting volleyball, and goalball challenged students to think differently about sport and to experience the value of accessible participation. Coaches and Power2Inspire facilitators guided students through each activity, emphasising teamwork, communication, and empathy.









One of the highlights of the day was seeing students naturally support one another, celebrating each other's efforts and achievements. The environment was positive, energetic, and affirming, exactly what inclusive sport aims to create.
