## YEAR 7 HISTORY TOUR OF CENTRAL LONDON

A group of our Year 7 history students were lucky enough to take part in a fascinating guided tour of central London, led by expert Blue Badge Guide, Louise Chapman. The tour brought to life many of the topics they've studied this year and gave students a deeper appreciation of the rich history surrounding them.



Highlights included visits to the Houses of Parliament, Westminster Abbey, and the historic statues around Parliament Square. On Whitehall, students stood on the very spot where King Charles I was executed, while learning more about the controversial role of Oliver Cromwell in that chapter of history.

Outside Westminster Abbey, students reflected on its national significance, with particular interest in the tomb of Mary, Queen of Scots, whose life they have recently explored in class. The group also visited Downing Street, the iconic Horse Guards Parade, and were thrilled to witness the Changing of the Guard, which that day featured Nepalese soldiers.



A well-earned rest in St James's Park gave students a chance to enjoy the sunshine – and spot the famous pelicans – before the tour ended at Buckingham Palace. On the way, they passed Pall Mall, which was being decorated with French flags ahead of the French President's visit to King Charles later that day.



It was a wonderful day that helped history leap off the page and into real life. Thank you to Louise Chapman, and our Chair of Governors, Jane Hargrave for making this possible.





This term, our Year 10 History students have been developing their extended writing skills using the Hochman Method – a structured approach that builds from sentence-level work to full essays. <p>The Cold War developed between 1945 and 1991 due to deep ideological differences between the USA and USSR, escalating through political conflicts and military tensions before ending with the collapse of the Soviet Union in 1991.</p>	
<p>During the beginning of the Cold War, a power vacuum emerged with the end of WW2 and the collapse of the Grand Alliance after the Tehran, Yalta and Potsdam conferences. This led to Stalin's creation of satellite states in the East of Europe such as Poland, East Germany and Czechoslovakia (C.Z.) with Churchill's announcement of an 'Iron Curtain' having fallen upon the world. As the ideological conflict intensified, Truman implemented the Truman Doctrine and Marshall Plan in quick succession of each other, setting one of the USA's key policies for the remainder of the Cold War: the containment of Communism. In retaliation, the Kopelevich set in place Cominform (1947) and Comecon (1949) as well as the Warsaw Pact (though in response to NATO (a defensive military alliance)).</p>

The Cold war, an approximately 50 year period of tension between Superpowers, The USA and USSR. lasted from 1945-1991 because each Superpower had which led to competition over Arms race and influence. Additionally when WW2 ended ends due to the USA using their first atomic bomb on Hiroshima and Nagasaki. The early tension between the Super-Powers started in the 1945-56. The 3 superpowers (USA, <sup>Tenran</sup> ~~su~~ and england) had 3 conferences <sup>Tenran</sup> ~~Yalta~~ and Potsdam. The first conference was Tenran which contained of Churchill, Roosevelt and Stalin. In this meeting they discussed how they was going to split <sup>Germany</sup> ~~Germany~~. During the Yalta conference it was the same 3 leaders but Roosevelt was sick with polio and was soon to die. In this conference they Germany surrendered and was divided into 4 zones.

The Cold War lasted for around 50 years, from 1945 to 1991. It was between the USA and USSR. They never fought directly but had many conflicts and arguments, mainly because they had different ideologies (Capitalism vs communism). It started after WW2 when USA ~~dropped~~ <sup>dropped</sup> atomic bombs on Japan. The USSR saw this as a huge threat. It was also about power and who would control the 'world' more.

After WW2, <sup>the Grand alliance</sup> ~~the allies~~ <sup>started</sup> ~~stopped~~ falls apart during the Truman, Potsdam and Yalta conference this happened in the year 1945 which involved the U.S, UK and Soviet Union. USSR took over a Eastern Europe and made satellite states. This scared USA and the West. Churchill set up the Iron Curtain between the East and West. USA then started the Truman Doctrine (the promise to contain the spread of communism) and the Marshall Plan to help countries not to become Communist.

There were many big crises in 1943-1956. In Berlin USSR blocked the roads trying to force out the West from West Berlin. USA flew in essentials such as food and water in Berlin by aircraft. Also in 1950-1953 the Korean War took place where USA helped South Korea and USSR (China) helped North. In 1956 there was a Hungarian Uprising where Hungary tried to rebel against USSR but Soviet tanks crushed them. USA didn't help because it was a huge risk. This made Eastern Europe terrified of USSR.

Liliia

The Cold War lasted from 1945 to 1991. It was between the USSR and the USA. They had different ideas: the USA supported capitalism, and the USSR supported communism. They did not fight directly but competed for power and weapons. They also took part in other wars like Korea, Vietnam and Afghanistan.

After World War two, the USSR and USA both wanted more control. The USA dropped atomic bombs on Japan. This made the USSR feel threatened. The Cold War began and ended in 1991 when the USSR collapsed.

At the end of Cold War, leaders met in Tenran, Yalta and Potsdam. Germany was divided into 4. The USSR took over Eastern Europe, which became known as the Iron Curtain. The USA started the Truman Doctrine and Marshall plan. The USSR made Cominform and Comecon. They blocked West Berlin, but the USA responded with the Berlin Airlift. In Hungary, people tried to rebel, but the USSR stopped them.

In the 1960s, many people escaped from East Berlin. The USSR built the Berlin Wall. Cuba became communist in 1959 and got help from the USSR. In 1962, the USA found Soviet missiles in Cuba. This led to the Cuban Missile Crisis, but war was avoided. In 1968, the Prague Spring happened, but the USSR sent in troops to stop it.

In the 1970s, the USA and USSR tried to reduce tension. They signed SALT 1 and the Helsinki accords. But in 1979, the USSR invaded Afghanistan. Tension rose again. In the 1980s, the USA started the Second Cold War. Regan

The Cold war, which was between 1945-1991, was between the USA and the USSR and the competition between their ideologies of communism and Capitalism, arms and overall influence over the world. The Power vacuum left after WW2, ~~the~~ left everything up for grabs. However this ended with the atomic bombing of Hiroshima & Nagasaki. ~~The~~ After <sup>so</sup> ~~long~~ <sup>years</sup> years after this the cold war ended with the collapse of the Soviet Union in 1991.

After the purging and after the WW2 conferences were held to talk about the current events. These conferences (held at Yalta, Potsdam and Tenran) were ~~held~~ attended by the Grand Alliance, which consisted of Britain, ~~Russia~~ and America. After WW2 ended the Grand Alliance fell apart as they no longer had any reason to pretend to be friends. During one of the conferences however, Stalin <sup>at Potsdam</sup> ~~was present~~ <sup>met</sup> President Truman. Truman promised Stalin <sup>that</sup> eastern European countries would be Soviet. So when he & Stalin eventually set up satellite states in these countries, relations between the Alliance began to fall as Churchill announced that there was now an Iron Curtain in ~~the~~ Europe. However the exception to this was Berlin, within Germany. Due to this, President Truman decided he would take his own precautions against communism. So in 1947 the Truman Doctrine was signed which was made to contain communism <sup>and to</sup> ~~to~~ <sup>for</sup> years.

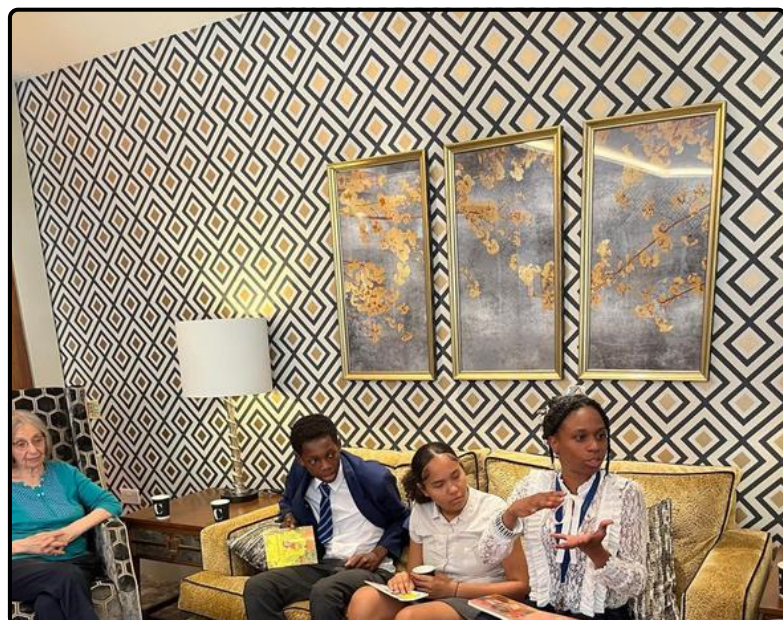

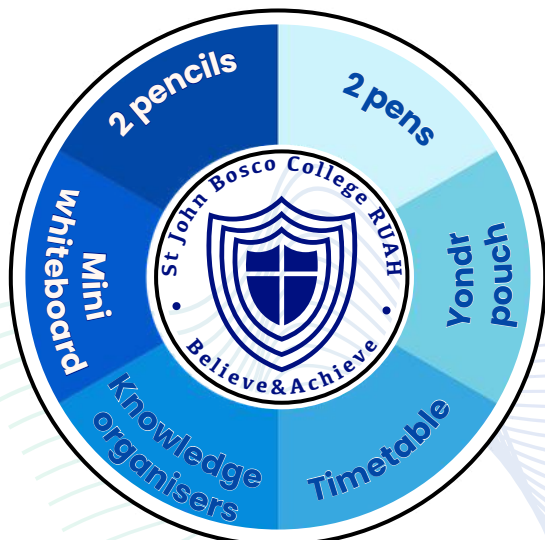
As we look ahead to September, each student will be issued with a new set of Knowledge Organisers for all subjects. These are essential learning tools and will play a key role in helping your child succeed.

If you require a replacement, or top up, these will be available from the school office and can be purchased by ParentMail or by cash.

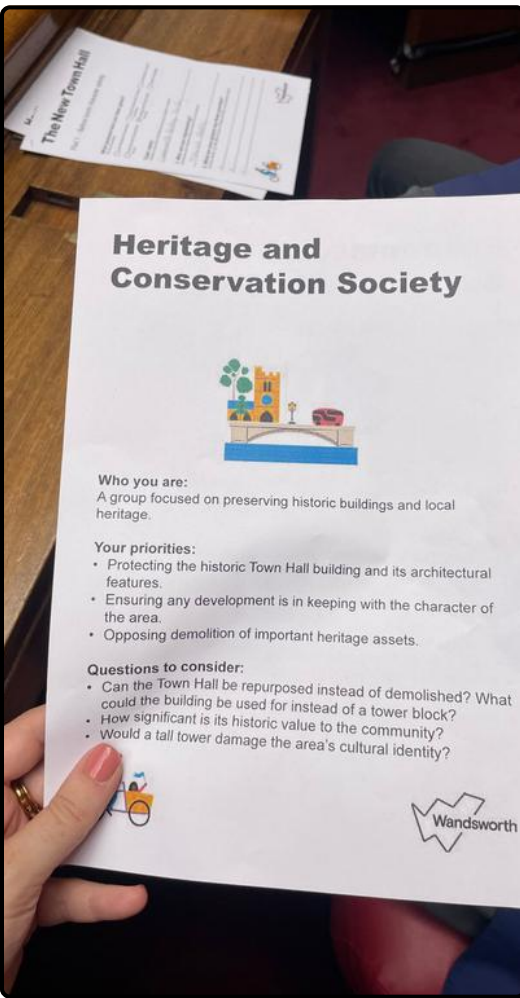
