This week's Bosco Discovery Talk welcomed George Turner from Carney's Community, a brilliant local youth charity based in Battersea. Carney's was founded to support young people from all backgrounds, using boxing as a positive "hook" alongside long-term, one-to-one mentoring and key worker support.



George spoke openly to our Sixth Form students about the power of routine, self-belief and community. It was especially lovely to hear that some of our students already attend Carney's, and could recognise the impact it has in helping young people build confidence, stay safe, and set ambitious goals.



Carney's offer far more than boxing: their wider work includes support into training and employment, and workshops that develop life skills and wellbeing (including areas such as mental health and wellbeing, beauty, cooking, photography, and money/employment skills). We are excited to strengthen our links with local partners like Carney's, and we are hoping to introduce after-school keep fit boxing sessions as a new school club very soon.

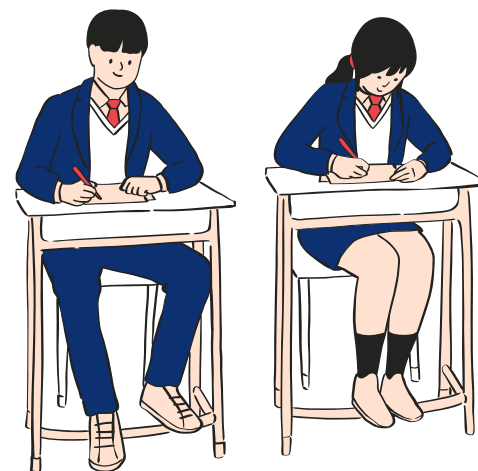

UPCOMING PPE EXAMS FOR YEARS 7-10 – JANUARY

With PPE exams for students in Years 7-10 beginning next week, we wanted to share a few simple and practical ways parents can support revision at home.

This can be a demanding time for young people, and a calm, encouraging environment can make a real difference to their focus and confidence. Alongside clear study routines, good sleep, healthy habits, and regular breaks, gentle reassurance and praise for effort can help reduce anxiety.

Reminding students that exams are just one part of their wider learning journey, and that they are supported every step of the way, can be especially reassuring during this busy period.



✓ 5 Ways You Can Support Your Child's Revision:

- ☐ Help them create a simple daily revision timetable and stick it on the fridge.
- ☐ Check they have a quiet space to work without distractions.
- ☐ Encourage screen-free breaks to rest their eyes and minds.
- ☐ Offer to quiz them using flashcards or topic questions.



✓ This should be a mix of subjects, with regular breaks – for example:

- ☐ 30 - 40 mins revision
- ☐ 10 min break
- ☐ Another 30 - 40 mins
