



The Year 11 Duke of Edinburgh students conquered the fields of Wheathampstead as part of their Duke of Edinburgh training.




YEAR 10 SCIENCE PRACTICALS

Year 10 Combined Science- Investigating electrical circuits: students had to construct series circuits and measure current and potential difference. We will build on this next week when we measure the resistance of a wire.



Year 10 Biology- Kidney dissection: students dissected sheep kidneys to identify parts of a kidney. This practical consolidated learning from the last few lessons on homeostasis and the kidney.

Wandsworth Youth Council is electing new Youth Leaders and a Youth Mayor — and every young person living in Wandsworth has the chance to vote!


Last week, our School Council met with Keziah Gordon, Wandsworth's Youth Participation Coordinator, who explained how young people can get involved.

Voting will take place during the week beginning 5th May at the following youth centres:


- BASE Youth Club, Danebury Avenue – **6th and 9th May from 3pm**
