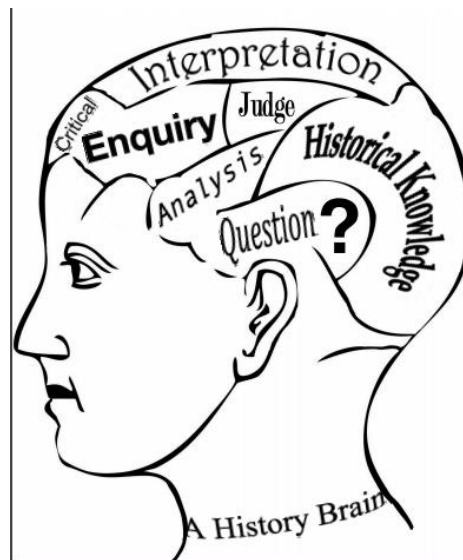


History A-Level Summer Transition Booklet
