

What Happens If A Student or Staff Member Shows Symptoms of the Coronavirus (COVID-19)



If a student or staff member displays symptoms at home, they must not come to school.



If a student or staff member displays symptoms at school, we will immediately send them home.







They must have a test as soon as possible to see if they have the virus.

They will have to stay at home until they receive their results.






If a student or staff member has a **positive test**, they **must isolate for 10 days** from the onset of symptoms.

They should only return to school if they do not have symptoms other than a cough or loss of smell or taste.

If a student test **negative**, feel well and no longer have symptoms similar to Coronavirus (COVID-19), they can stop self-isolating and return to school.



We will send a letter to you, letting you know that someone in their bubble has tested positive for Coronavirus (COVID-19).



Those who have been in 'close contact' with the infected person will need to be sent home and asked to self-isolate for 14 days.

If anyone sent home starts to develop symptoms, they should immediately seek a test for Coronavirus and inform the school of the outcome.





We will ensure that classrooms have had a deep clean and we will send you a letter confirming when the bubble can return to school.
