


Why is attendance important?

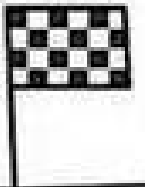
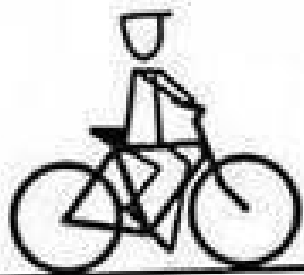
Attendance (%)	Consequence

If attendance can be improved by 5%, a student's GCSE grades can be improved by ½ a grade.



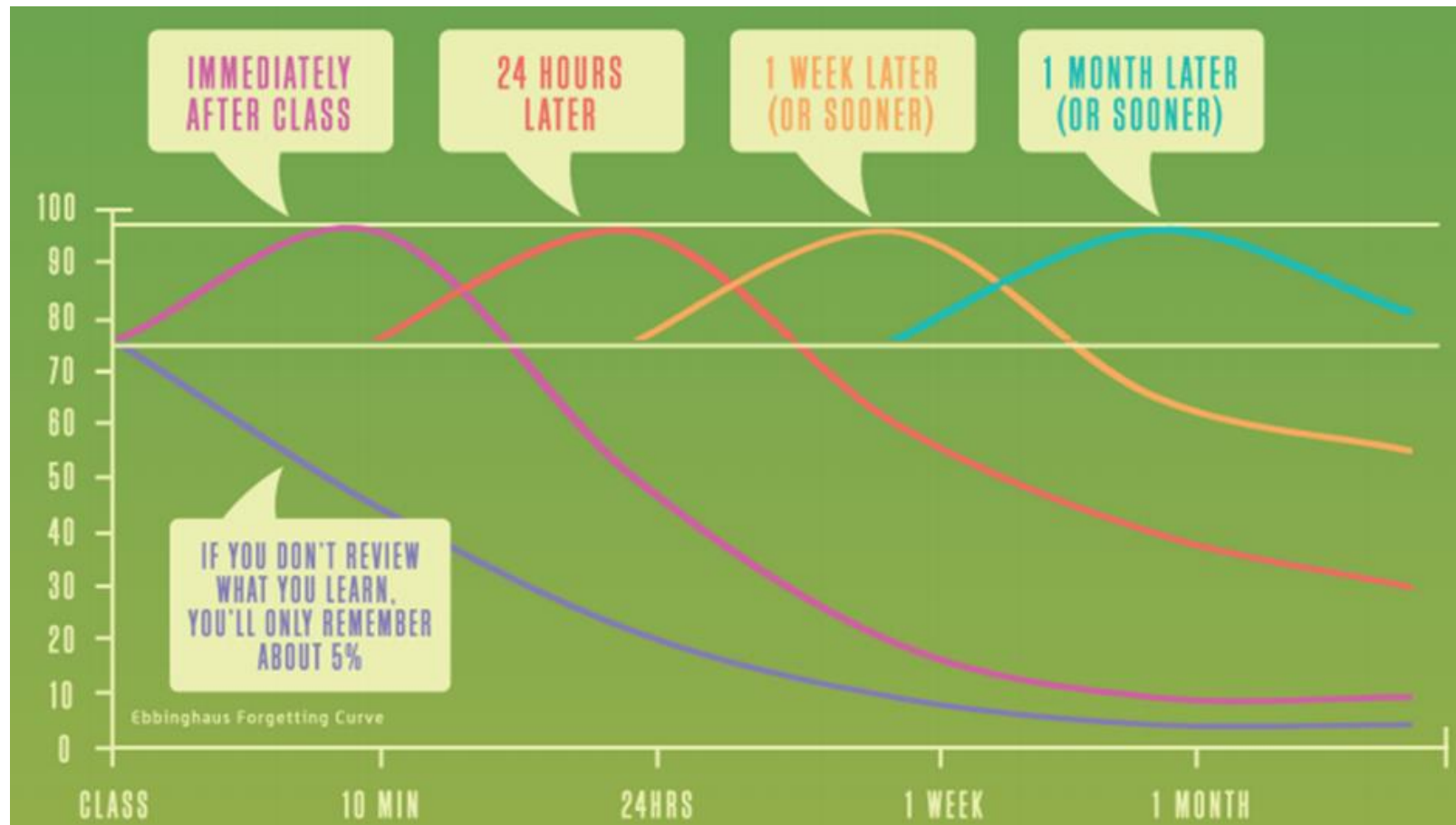
Did you know that you forget 80% of what you learn in the first 24 hours!

Revision can be really overwhelming simply because of the size of the task.

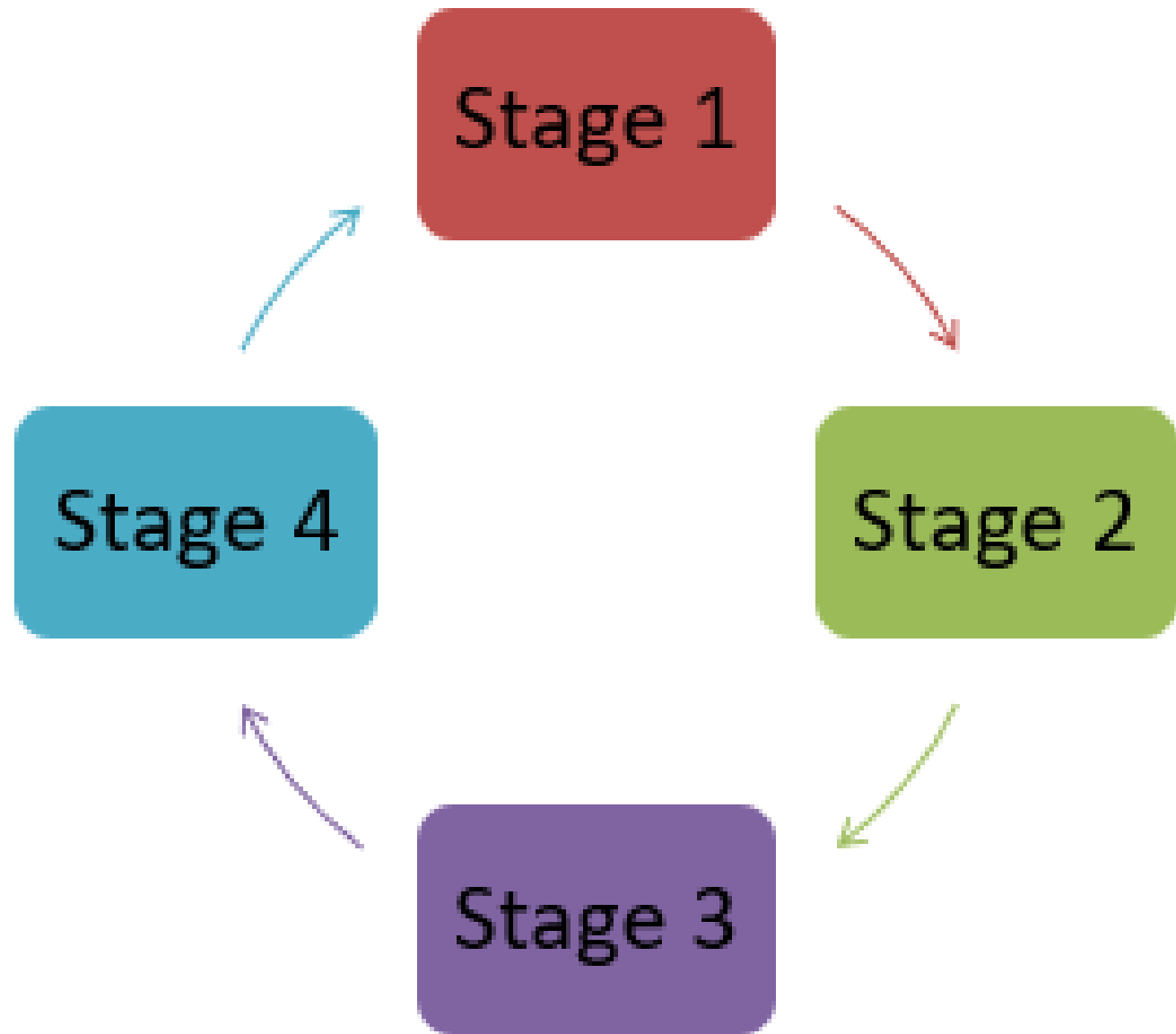

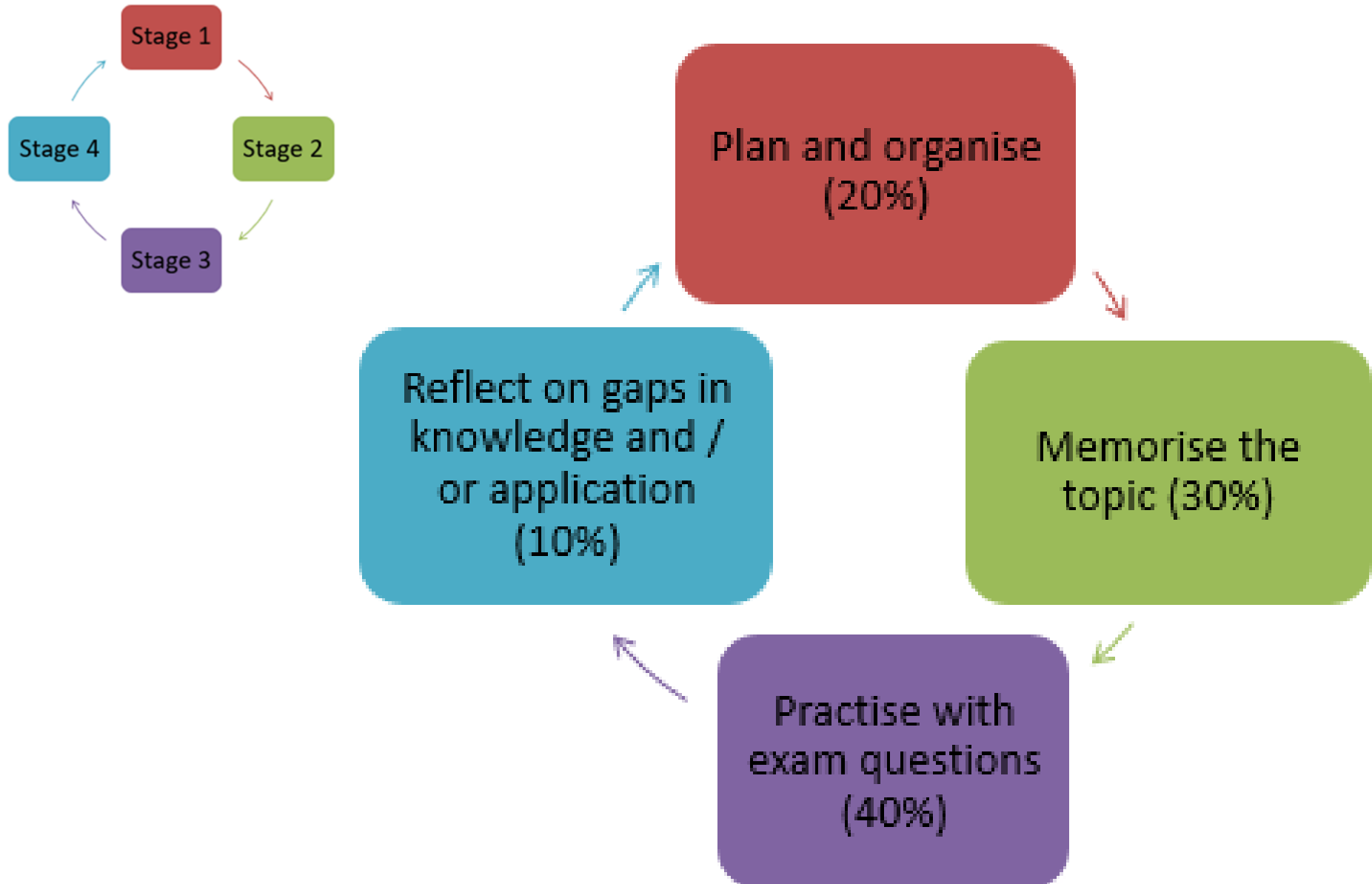

The four stages of revision



Stage 1: Plan and organise

- Gather books, notes revision guides into individual piles
- Add to difficult or uncertain topics through extra reading
- Plan a schedule using exam timetable
- Use lots of different styles of note taking to maintain interest
 - Summary on a card
 - Mind map
 - Read / Cover / Recall
 - Colour coding key themes.

Stage 2: Memorise the topic

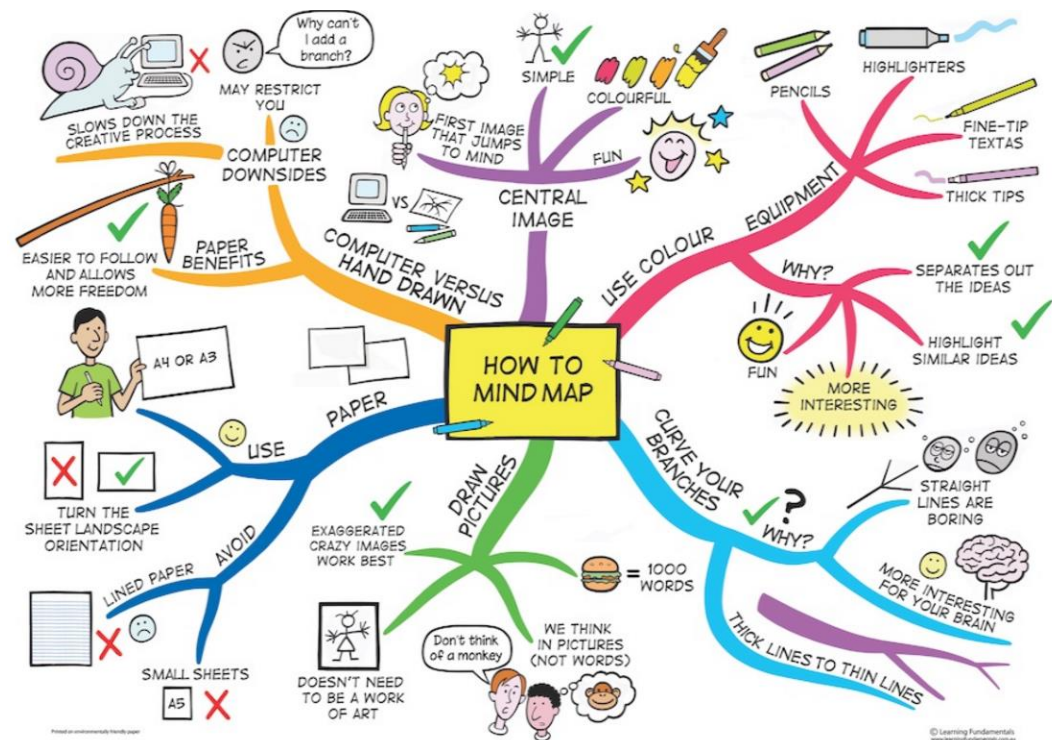
This is crucial to GCSE success but will only work if stage 1 is done well.

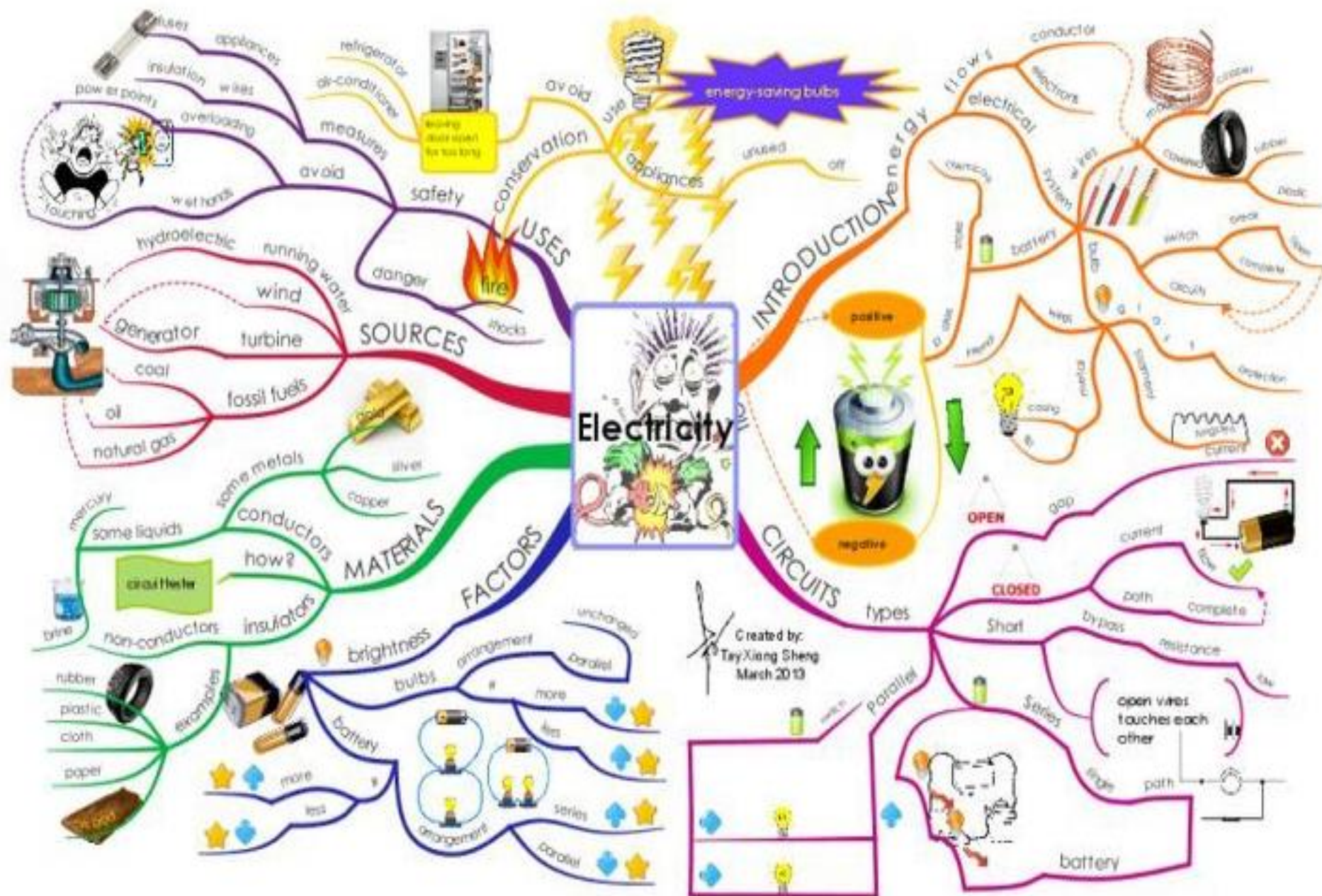
- Short sharp bursts

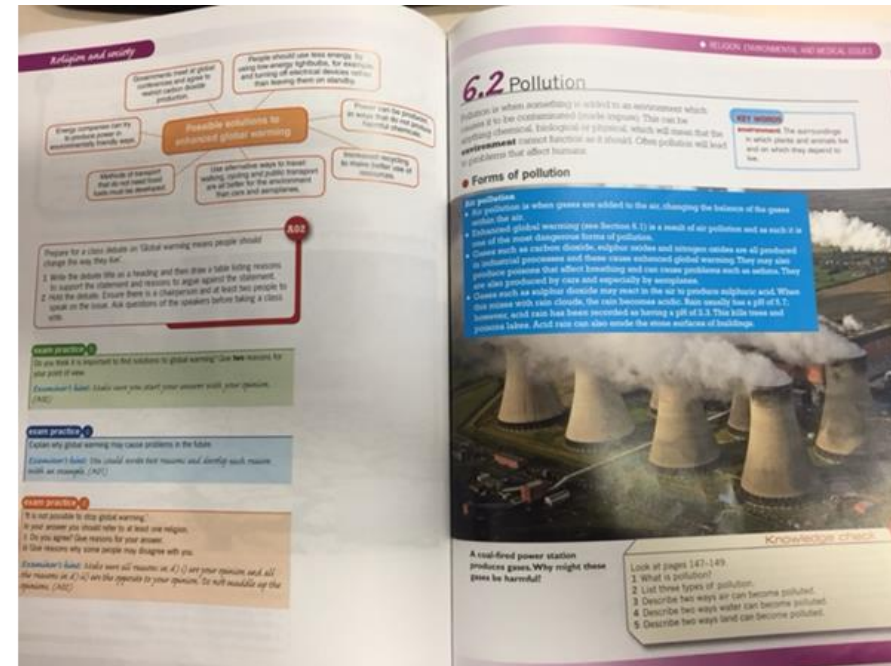
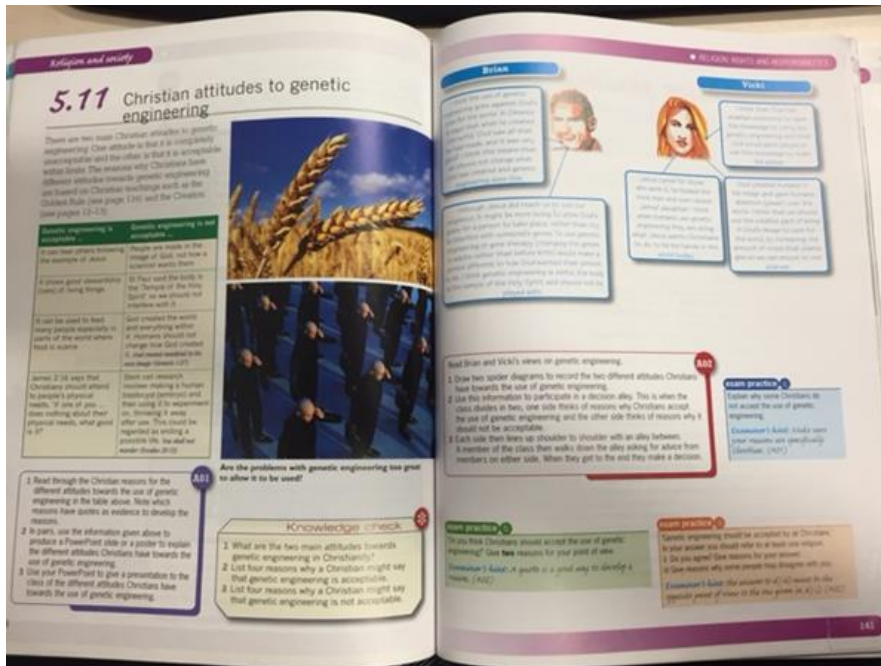

The important thing is that you must then do something active with the knowledge.



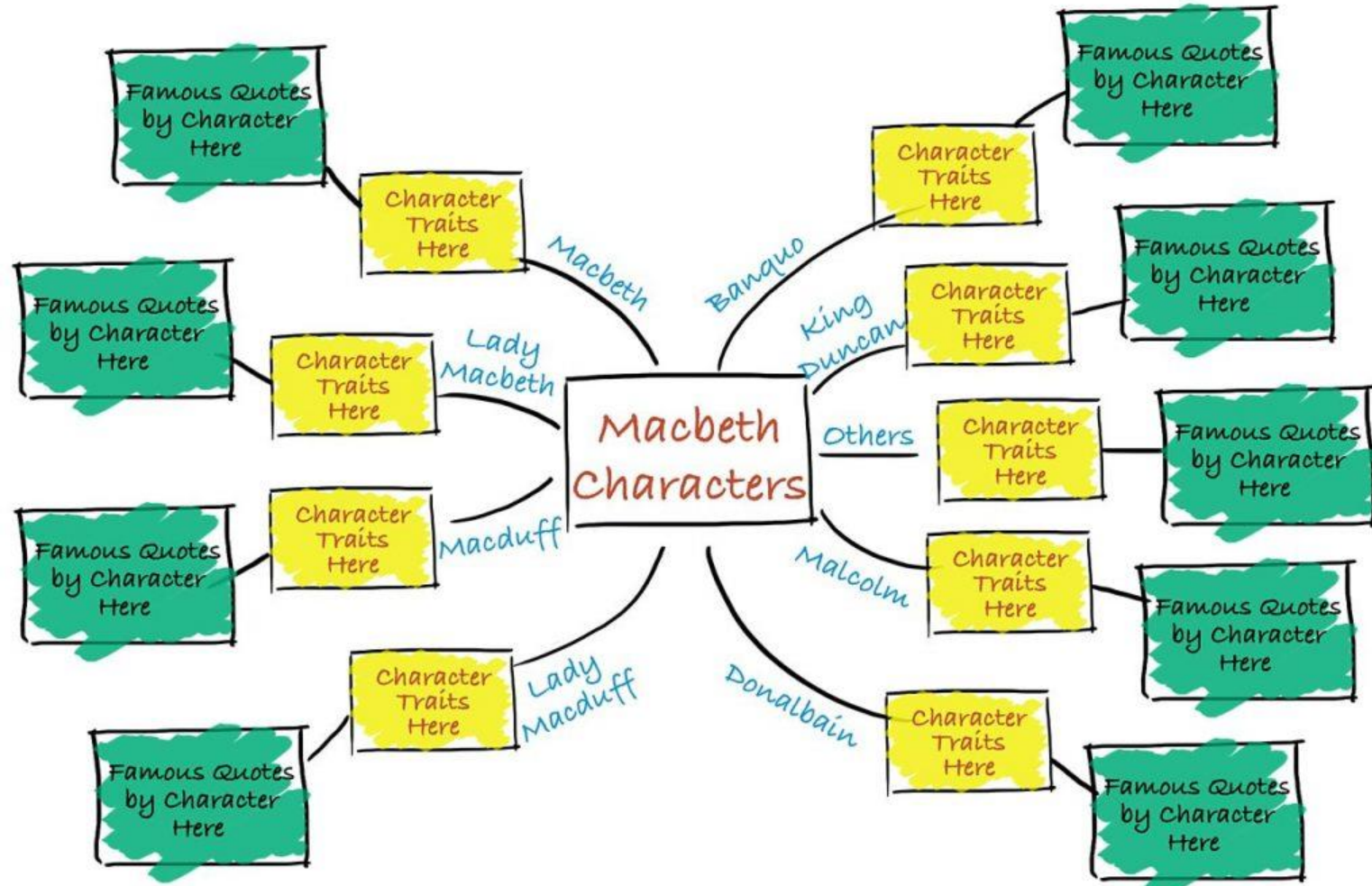

Malpractice
